4-Year Programme

The Learn to Live School offers a holistic approach for youth who, due to socio-economic circumstances, cannot gain access to, or cope in, mainstream schooling. Skills training and an academic curriculum through project-based-learning is utilised as a method of teaching and learning for youth between the ages of **14 and 18**.

Minimum Requirements

Learner must turn 14 on the 1st day of January in the year of admission.

Learners referred to us, must have prior special needs identified (SIAS 2014).

Grade 5 reading & writing capability a necessity in order to cope with project-based-learning demands.

Learners with severe behavioral disorders will not be accepted due to strict safety workshop protocols.

Workshops follow the Western Cape Education Department's skills curricular for Schools of Skills.

Learners are assessed on a regular basis and are able to achieve accredited unit-based standards and thus work towards Seta qualifications.

Once having completed the School of Skills programme, youth will be better prepared for work and assisted to seek employment in various industries. Those who wish to study further after leaving Learn to Live are referred to adult education centers.
